We need to put Maryland on a path to a zero waste economy. I support a 5 cent tax on plastic bags state wide, as well as a deposit fee on bottles and cans. This can significantly increase recycling and the market for recycled content products. We can also make significant efforts to decrease food waste through food recovery, and increased composting. We should phase out trash incineration.

How can we expand the role the County's schools play in the support of a healthy local food system and the success of local agriculture? Do you support a rural schools' policy that provides equity for Reserve cluster schools acknowledging the unique nature of schools in region set aside for farmland and open space preservation?
